My interest in genealogy

I have been a member of AJGS (VIC) for many years and a committee member since 2019.

I was born in London and emigrated to Australia with my family in 1967 on the £10 Assisted Migration Scheme. My mother's family originally came from Poland and Lithuania, whilst my father's family was originally from Russia, Romania and Latvia.

By the late 1890s, most of my great grandparents had left their respective homes and were settled in the Whitechapel area of the East End where they lived for many years.

My interest in genealogy started as a young child, as my mother told many stories of growing up with cousins and extended family members in the 1930-1940s; stories of coping with the London blitz, being evacuated and the rationing of food and goods during WW2. Sadly, shortly after the war, my maternal grandfather learnt of the deaths of two of his sisters and their families in the Shoah.

Having researched my family's past for over 25+ years, I am now in the process of disseminating information to family members.
