More than two million pages of historical directories, yizkor books, secondary school records, military documents, and community and personal histories are full-text and Soundex searchable for free at genealogyindexer.org. As of June 2025, the search engine covers about 4500 sources, summarized below. Under Directories, the number in parentheses is typically the count with that scope and no smaller (e.g., 54 Bydgoszcz directories), the main exception being German states, where the count includes directories for towns and districts.
